

Lent is also a time when we would normally look at the activities of Christian Aid. We watched a video about the work that is being done by Christian Aid to provide Water Wells in areas without power. This is enabling villagers to grow fruit and vegetables, feed their animals, make bricks and improve their health. Using a Tupperware, Stones, Soil, Water and the top from a soap dispenser we were able to demonstrate how it all works! We will pray for those without water during Lent.

We continue every Sunday on Zoom at 10am for the Sunday Clubbers. Regular members will receive an email with a Zoom link but contact the Church Office for more details if you would like to join us. We are all looking forward to when we can be together again.
